Two Labour Candidates Adopted

Cherry Hinton and East Chesterton Wards

Mr. Stanley Ambrose has been adopted as prospective Labour candidate in Cherry Hinton Ward, and Mr Robert Davis in East Chesterton Ward for the City Council elections in May.

Both candidates were adopted unanimously after the Ward Committees had been addressed by the adopted candidates and two other nominees

'NEED FOR YOUNG PEOPLE'

Mr. Ambrose is 24 and in his address to the Ward Committee he said that he hoped that his age would not be held against him for he felt that there was a real need for young people in the Council Chamber, most sections of the community were represented there but the voice of youth could not be heard. He felt sure that the electors of Cherry Hinton would remedy that, His particular interests were housing and education for "the two are inseparable without ideal conditions in one the other could not hope to improve".

Mr. Ambrose has had considerable experience in Labour Party work. He is Secretary of the Labour Party League of Youth Cambridge is member of the United Nations Youth Section Committee, and is the Political Education Officer of the City Labour Party. He lives at 85 Birdwood road and is the Chairman of the City end of Cherry Hinton's Ward Committee. He has lived in the Ward for 13 years.

The Chairman of Cherry Hinton Village Committee (Mr.E.Orriss) said that this vote of confidence in Mr. Ambrose was a vote of confidence in youth and progress, and that every ounce of effort would back the candidate to secure the first victory for Labour in Cherry Hinton.
