The recreation ground might also be a possible site though it is not much overlooked and we are conscious that we do have some antisocial behaviour in our area. **Does anyone** have any other ideas where this might be sited? It needs to be accessible and overlooked for security. If you want to be involved to do some planning or digging and planting – young or old and those in the middle – do get in touch.

Another idea is for volunteers to help those who have a garden but can't manage its upkeep. We could also think about further 'guerrilla gardening' – as in Glyn's little patch by the middle bus stop in Birdwood Rd. The Council gardeners do not mow or put weed-killer on it if it is visible to them.
