

AGM issues – parking and parking – and did I mention parking?

The AGM was small but beautifully formed. Jeremy Benstead, one of our City Councillors and the current Mayor of Cambridge, came and chatted informally to the people present. Noel Kavanagh, our County Councillor spoke about the proposed citywide residents' parking scheme. This will not affect us in the first instance, as we do not have the problem of commuter parking – and there will be consultation in each area before any changes.

The discussion raised two issues which some residents feel very strongly about: insensitive parking by their neighbours and parking on the grass verges. Parking was seen as an issue throughout our area – St Thomas's Square and the Tiverton Way area were mentioned. But the biggest gripe was constant parking on the verges in Birdwood Rd. This has made some of them mud-baths in winter and concrete-hard in summer.

We were advised that parking on the road and not on the verge is preferable for two reasons. 1. It preserves the verges as green spaces that carry away run-off of heavy rain, so assisting in flood prevention, and 2. Parked cars on the road provide natural chicanes which slow the rat-run traffic which uses our roads to avoid problems at the Budgens roundabout. So the plea goes out – please, please park sensitively, away from junctions, with due respect for your neighbours and not on the grass verges.

The Association's finances are healthy. The City Council has given us a grant each time we have applied and our main outgoings are on our newsletter and the events we organise in St Thomas's Hall. At the AGM we recruited a new member to the committee. Hooray!
