Past events

We are very grateful to Cambridge City Council for their continued support. Without their annual grant we would not be able to provide free events and this newsletter. With an additional grant from the City Council we were able to cover the cost of the coach trip to Norwich and offer some free places. We don't think it will be our turn again for a City Council Community Action Day (the one with the skips) but if we are offered one we will be glad to accept! It was very popular this year and the good weather ensured that a lot of items were taken away.

Buses again!

The County Council is responsible for the roundabout works at Queen Edith's Way. I have written to them about the lack of consultation about the long and short-term effects for bus users. This is the gist of what I have written on your behalf (Jane Phillips, Chair BARA):

'This area contains many City Council properties, old people and disabled residents. All of these vulnerable groups deserve to be able to attend their hospital appointments without changing buses. Many have regular appointments so will be more adversely affected than the average. These works will take place over winter, and the bus stop to change on Cherry Hinton Road (towards Addenbrooke's) has no shelter or seating.

I was told by Grant Weller (from the County council) that there was extensive consultation with people living in Queen Edith's. I have since learnt that Queen Edith's Way Residents' Assn have consistently argued against the roundabout ever since they examined the literature on this design about two years ago.

They quote a TfL capacity report: We also considered a number of designs at Lambeth Bridge north including a signalised junction and a 'Dutch style' roundabout with a physically separated cycle track around the edge of the roundabout. However, our modelling indicated that this would have had significant impact on journey times for other road users in the area, including thousands of bus passengers.

TfL have not installed a single roundabout of this type anywhere across the metropolis.'
