There are elections on 6<sup>th</sup> May for Cambridge City Council, Cambridgeshire County Council, Police and Crime Commissioner and Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority Mayor. If you do not want to vote in person, you can get a postal vote or appoint a proxy to vote for you. The City Council officers would like you to do this as soon as possible. Here are the details:

#### Pavements

For the past 5 years, we have been complaining to the County Council about the state of the pavements in Birdwood Rd. Two years ago we were promised that they would be repaired. Nothing has happened. Our new Labour candidate for the County Council is taking this up on our behalf. We have completed a survey of the pavements in Birdwood, Ward, Gray and Chalmers Roads. The County Council will only fill holes if they are more than 2cms deep. In Birdwood Rd alone we have counted 130 holes which qualify.

### **Birdwood Road and Speeding**

Without asking for an opinion from the residents assn, another County Councillor (not ours) has applied to the County Council for funding for speed bumps to be installed in Birdwood Rd. We have said vociferously that we believe a more rounded solution is needed – not just speed bumps – as Birdwood Rd is dangerous. We have suggested chicanes to slow the traffic as bumps cause motorists to brake and revv up again – thus increasing pollution. Chicanes, apparently, are too expensive! If the funding for bumps is forthcoming, we have been informed that residents will be consulted.
